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Grade 1 ready to learn and less students requiring significant support. She did point to a slight decline in results for Indigenous Prekindergarten and Kindergarten students, and emphasized that the Division continues to focus on that priority. Mr. Erik Van Dusen, Coordinator, Assessment and Education Technology, highlighted the use of Seesaw, a learning journal application used in all Prekindergarten and Kindergarten classrooms. He noted the increased engagement with parents and families through the use of the application, provided an example of student growth, and presented data information collected during the past year. Ms. Juanita Redekopp-McKeown, Supervisor of Instruction, summarized the strategic actions relative to this priority, noting biennial and bi-annual meetings with Ministry and other school divisions. She outlined data analysis and short- and long-term actions. She described professional development opportunities for Prekindergarten and Kindergarten teachers, as well as partnerships with the Early Learning Family Centres and the United Way of Regina. She concluded by reporting on the transition to full-day Kindergarten, and the implementation of the Early Learning Intensive Support pilot and the Early Learning Deaf and Hard of Hearing pilot. Mr. Boldt, Ms. Gatzke, Mr. Van Dusen, and Ms. Redekopp-McKeown responded to questions relative to the Seesaw application, usage monitoring and expansion plans, the number of Early Years assessments completed, the process for assessment, professional development requirements, and provincial data comparability. Board members expressed appreciation for the presentation.
